

Gold for Northholm Grammar School

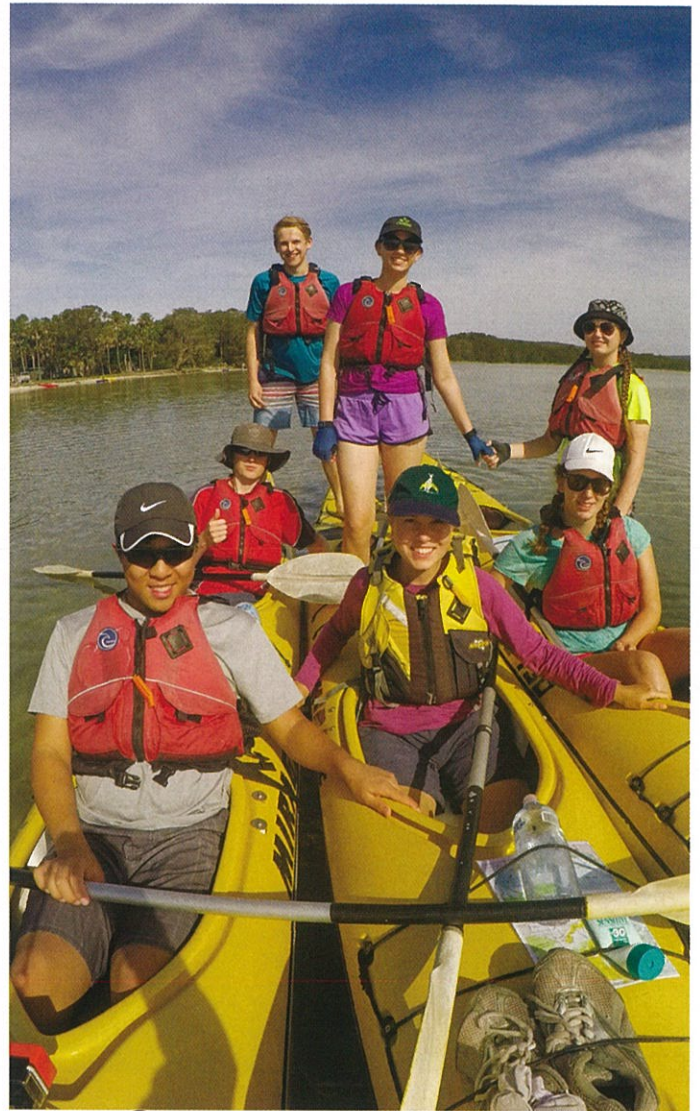
