

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Junior School

The introduction of Years Three and Four in 2010 and Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two in 2015 has given the School a new dimension with the influx of new families who share a common interest in providing their children with a rich and supportive educational experience.

Environmental Sustainability

Northholm has sought to implement more sustainable practices in all areas of the School's operation including more energy efficient buildings and more responsible use of resources.

Agriculture

The establishment of the Agricultural Trade Training Centre and adjoining gardens has created the impetus for significant development of the School's Agriculture program. This is reflective of the increased significance Agriculture plays in the Australian economy and the School's commitment to more sustainable practice. This will extend into the Junior School Program.

Creative Expression

Creative Arts has been high on Northholm's agenda over the last five years: The opportunities provided through these programs are integral to the development of a richer cultural life and the capacity to engage effectively in a contemporary society.

Community Service

Northholm has expanded its service program to include a dedicated Week of Service Learning. This involvement has had a marked impact on our students' ability to empathise with others and to demonstrate greater tolerance and compassion.

- the redevelopment of the Stables for Middle Years students
- the construction of the Agricultural Trade Training Centre
- the refurbishment of rooms for Year Seven
- the refurbishment of the Visual Arts Centre
- the installation of a wireless network and 100 megabit synchronous internet connection
